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applicants and need to schedule interviews for the Town Manager 1 position. The interim Town Manager will continue on a monthly basis. 2 They are hoping to interview six candidates in May. 3 4 5 Legal: The committee provided Council with a copy of the preliminary draft 6 of the Charter. 7 8 9 Changes of note include the Mayor regaining the right to vote, the Town Manager will have authority over staff, and a storm water 10 11 management fee. 12 The Town's contract with LCWA is being reviewed for potential 13 updates. During conversations about the contract, matters such as 14 alternative water sources, response time, and representation on the 15 LCWA board were also discussed. 16 17 Litter: 18 19 The committee presented the idea of charging for more citizens who 20 21 have more than one trash can and a limit on brush. 22 The committee will schedule a day for Clean-Up Louisa. 23 24 A business on Main Street does not have a can and is dumping their 25 trash in the trash cans on the sidewalks, causing overflow. The 26 committee will attempt to have a conversation with the business 27 28 owner. 29 Finance: 30 31 32 The committee reported they are finalizing Capital Improvement needs and will be scheduling a budget work session. 33 34 Cemetery: 35

The committee provided an operational cost overview, which they are 1 reviewing, and the need to up the fees at Hillcrest. 2 3 There was discussion regarding the ownership of Oakland Cemetery 4 because the committee was asked about the ability to fly the 5 confederate flag, the committee will be researching this topic. 6 7 The committee presented the idea of potentially designated scattering 8 grounds. 9 10 11 The committee is debating whether the lower portion of the cemetery is a wetland or not and the potential of only allowing flat stones in that 12 13 area. 14 15 STAFF REPORTS: 16 17 Police: 18 19 Sgt. Matthew Fallon provided the Police Report. 20 21 22 The department is starting to prepare for National Night Out. 23 Four officers worked the "Hands Off" protest. There were no incidents 24 and the organizers cleaned up afterwards. 25 26 27 The department is increasing foot patrol on Main Street. 28 **Public Works:** 29 30 31 Anthony Larry, Public Works Director, provided the Public Works 32 Report. 33 34 The department has started clearing easements, railway 35 maintenance, and painting fire hydrants. In the upcoming months. they will be painting and working on aesthetics. 36
