She provided the invocation and led the pledge of 22 allegiance. 23 **BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR:** 24 25 Dana Racette, town resident at 213 Cutler Avenue, stood and 26 addressed the Council regarding the quality of the water. She would 27 like people to be contacted on updates from the town, including 28 hydrant flushing. She asked Council who is responsible for paying for 29 30 the extra residential flushing that happens when the town is flushing hydrants. During her conclusion, she asked for statistics regarding 31 the town Facebook and website views, as well as what the Town is 32 doing to provide more information. 33 34 Acting- Mayor Harte responded that the town is looking at new 35 services with better communication systems. 36

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Bethany Racette, town resident at 213 Cutler Avenue, stood and 1 addressed the Council and detailed the water issues she has 2 encountered since the age of eight. Appointment of Town Treasurer and Town Clerk. 17 18 The Town Manager introduced the new Town Treasurer, 19 Franchesca Mall-Padilla, and new Town Clerk, Stephanie Dorman. 20 21 22 Motion to appoint Franchesca Mall-Padilla as Town Treasurer. 23 Motion made by Purcell, Seconded by Henry. 24 Voting For: Rigsby, Purcell, Crawford, Henry, 25 26 Motion to appoint Stephanie Dorman as Town Clerk. 27 28 29 Motion made by Purcell, Seconded by Henry. Voting For: Rigsby, Purcell, Crawford, Henry. 30 31 2. Discussion of a Technology Overlay District. 32 33 Acting- Mayor Harte presented for discussion the topic of a 34 Technology Overlay District and the potential impacts it could have 35 on the Town. 36

The potential overlay would be in the industrial airport. 1 2 3 Council member Henry agrees with the positioning of the overlay and that taxes from a tech company could be a significant source 4 of revenue. 5 6 7 Council member Rigsby is open to receiving additional research and discussing the future possibilities, adding that the town needs 8 to be cognizant of the existing infrastructure. She suggested a 9 sub-committee be formed to see if this is feasible. 10 11 12 Council member Crawford spoke about a business from his 13 hometown and urged the Council to be cautious, citing the existing 14 infrastructure. 15 16 Council member Purcell shares the same viewpoint as Council member Rigsby and the potential impact on the water system and 17 public utilities. 18 19 20 Council member Henry wants to make sure it is written in a 21 manner that protects the town and is of value. 22 23 Acting- Mayor Harte established a sub-committee to conduct research and limitations of a Technology Overlay District. This 24 sub-committee will be under the Legal Committee and should 25 include the Planning Commission. 26 27 3. Discussion on lighting options for the Town's entry signs. 28 29 Council member Henry has been working with Virginia Power for 30 lighting options for the Town's entry signs. He received a quote of 31 \$1,800 per sign. This quote includes the poles, digging, and 32 receptacles. 33 34 35 Council member Purcell would like a diagram. 36 37 Council member Rigsby had questions about the poles and the right of way. Public Works Director, Anthony Larry, advised the 38 39 poles would not obstruct the sign and the poles would be in its

1		right-of-way. Council member Rigsby would like it to be aesthetic.
